A book was sent to Alaska and this single man learned to cook using the book. "That was a fun thing that happened," she said.

We used to talk about working families (*of all* races, ethnicity and neighborhoods) opportunities to buy a home.

Then along came foreclosures that are not declining. Last year the number of foreclosure filings declined, but they are rising again. Banks are tightening up their criteria for mortgage loan applications, reducing the number of mortgage loans. Will we have more renters and less homeowners?

Some housing experts contend that fewer homeowners may be desirable. If there are fewer homeowners. how will this affect the demographics of communities and the sense of ownership and participation in neighborhoods? Homeownership is not for everyone. However besides the sense of ownership, it also gives people some way to build up equity.

### **A Save From Foreclosure**

A WIN housing counselor recently reported a success in helping an older couple in their mid-seventies get a loan modification from Bank of America. They had tried to get a modification since 2010 because the husband broke his back in 2009 and had other financial issues. They were unsuccessful in getting help from Bank of America when they contacted WIN. After Four months of work, the WIN counselor found out that there was an identity theft issue with their taxes because the IRS has sent a transcript stating inaccurately that they were living in Florida with an income of \$200,000 per year. 


