Well known Northsider Jan Holland has died

Janet Holland was found dead in her home on Saturday, March 2nd. She was 70 years old.

Jan was a long time resident of Hayes Avenue in Northside. For many years she was a Ward Chairman and member of the Executive Committee of the Democratic Party in Hamilton County.

She was a lifelong member of the St. Philip's Episcopal Church on Kirby Road.

Jan was very active with the Northside-College Hill Kiwanis. She was President for many years and most recently served as Vice-President of the Club. She often said that she felt that "everyone should be a Kiwanian".

Jan's passions included the Kiwanis, her church, service veterans, and her cats. She felt so strongly about the veterans that she pushed for the

Kiwanis Club to build a mobile Veterans Wall. It is currently located at the Postmans' Hall on Colerain Avenue and Blue Rock in Northside.

She was also the power behind the Kiwanis Club sponsoring the Memorial Day Service at Wesleyan Cemetery.

The world wasn't always fair to Jan, but she always tried her best and she will be missed. Her faith in God helped her through the many challenges she faced and we can be assured that she is with her savior in heaven.
